# Case Report - Nasapratinaha ( Deviated Nasal Septum )

#### Abstract:

In present global scenario, Ayurveda has gained more importance because of its holistic approach towards the health and personalized medicine. Nasapratinaha is one among the 31 Nasa roga in which nasal obstruction is the main symptoms. In modern it is correlated with Deviated Nasal Septum. Deviated Nasal Septum is one of the most prevalent complaint and major public health challenges worldwide. A Deviated septum occurs when your nasal septum is significantly displaced to one side, making one nasal air passage smaller than the other. Nasapratinaha is a condition in which vitiation of Kapha dosha along with Udana vayu vaigunya in nasa which is responsible for the manifestation of the disease. The role of Kapha dosha has a prominent part because nasa is one of the sthana of Kapha along with Vata and other dosha causes Nasavorodha (Nasal obstruction). The symptoms like Pain in area of sinuses, Runny nose, Headache, Nose bleed, Loss of smell, Nasal obstruction etc. Deviated Nasal Septum can be treated with surgical and medical methods. The surgical and medical managements have their own limitations, merits and demerits like Synechiae formation, Rhinitis sicca, Sever bleeding, Septal perforation, Septal haematoma, septal abscess etc. In Ayurvedic classics the line of treatment for Nasapratinaha is Snehapana, Nasya, Dhumapana, Shirobasti etc. Nasapratinaha is the hetu of other complaints like chronic rhinitis which convert in sinusitis and other infection like throat infection. In the present case, 39 year old female patient came to Shalakyatantra OPD of SMBT Ayurved Hospital having a symptoms like Blocking sensation in nose, Heaviness in head, Pain over nose and sinuses, throat pain, headache and diagnosed with Left Deviated Nasal Septum. The line of treatment - Shirolepa of Vacha, Tapa sweda of Ajwain, Gandusha of Triphala churna and Haridra churna kwatha, Sitopaladi churna and Talisadi churna, Lakshmivilas Ras, Chandraprabhavati. Around 70% improvement in sign and symptoms were achieved after the medication.

#### Introduction

Nasal obstruction is a very common and troublesome complaint in ENT practice. The main causative factor for this condition is deviated nasal septum. Deformity of the nasal septum can also result in enlarged turbinates. As per Ayurvedic classics, Nasapratinaha is a condition in which vitiation of Kapha dosha along with udana vayu vaigunya in nasa which is responsible for the manifestation of the disease. The role of Kapha dosha has a prominent part because nasa is one of the sthana of Kapha along with Vata and other dosha causes Nasavarodha (nasal obstruction). The symptoms like Pain in area of sinuses, Runny nose, Headache, Nose bleed, Loss of smell, Nasal obstruction etc. Nasapratinaha is the hetu of other complaints like chronic rhinitis which convert in sinusitis and other infection like throat infection. Management of Deviated Nasal Septum in modern science is through medications such as nasal decongestants, antihistamines, nasal sprays and surgical procedure known as septoplasty. The symptoms usually reappear after the withdrawal of medication. Prolonged usage of antihistamines and nasal sprays are not recommended because which are cause unnecessary side effects like drowsiness, epistaxis, drying and crusting and the surgical approach has also failed to achieve desired results. Therefore, an alternative solution in Ayurveda is sought which provides relief from all the symptoms of the disease as well as reducing the recurrent attacks. Snehapana, Nasya, Dhoompana, Shirolepa, Tapa Sweda, Shirobasti, Upnaha etc. are advised in Ayurveda classics for Nasa Pratinaha. The line of treatment - Shirolepa of Vacha, Tapa sweda of Ajwain, Gandusha of Triphala churna and Haridra churna kwatha, Sitopaladi churna and Talisadi churna, Lakshmivilas Ras, Chnadraprabhavati were given.

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A 39-year-old female patient presented with the complaints of blocking sensation in both nostrils, heaviness in head, headache, pain over nose, pain over area of sinuses, throat pain since 2/3 years.

#### On examination

- Local examination\_ External nose was normal with widened anterior nares.
- Anterior Rhinoscopic examination- Deviated nasal septum towards left side, and inferior turbinate in right side of cavity was markedly hypertrophied with congestion of the nasal mucous membrane.

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• Throat examination-Post pharyngeal wall congestion.

#### **Past History**

Patient had taken medical treatment which included a variety of antihistamines decongestant and topical since 3 years; but get relief as long as in use. Advice surgery but patient was not wiiling for surgery. After discontinuation of medication recurrence in the symptoms of Nasapratinaha was observed. As the disease was not treated with medical treatment and leading to complications like sleep apnoea and mouth

breathing. Sthanika chikitsa and abhyantara chikitsa was selected in this case.

 Routine hematology investigations were done- within normal limits.

# • Radiological evaluation-

CT PNS Scan (plain)- confirmed that diagnosis through the presence of deviated nasal septum with convexity toward left and right inferior turbinate mucosal thickening.

*Shirolepa* is a special procedure of application of medicated paste on the head.

Vacha- the magical root of this herb has Kapha-Vata shamaka properties. With Ushana Tikshna guna it relievs the Kapha Vata dosha. The cell membrane which are made up of phospholipids, absorbs the lipid soluble medicinal extract which is covered over the head containing various pharmacological action like antioxidants, anti-inflammatory and analgesic property. It useful in reducing pain and inflammation.

*Tapa sweda* means application of direct heat to the body parts. Swedana by its qualities like Ushna, Tikshna acts for stimulation in the body. It increases the metabolic rate in the body. Ushna guna of sweda dilates the capillaries and it increases circulation and help to relieve the swelling and inflammation of sinus congestion.

*Tapa sweda of Ajwain*- 2-3 tbsp of ajwain roasted on tawa and added it in a cloth to make a potli. The ajwain smoke from the potli will help in unblocking nose and easing congestion.

Gandusha with Triphala churna and Haridra churna kwatha – Filling the mouth with medicated water daily and holding for a few minutes without moving it inside the oral cavity is called Gandusha. Gandusha is the signature treatment in Ayurveda for throat pain. It soothes the throat and reduces Shotha-Inflammation, Shoola-pain, Jwara-Fever, Aruchi-Anorexia in a very precise manner.

Triphala has immunomodulatory qualities as well as Shothahara (anti-inflammatory) and Ropana (healing) characteristics, as well as anti-oxidant properties.

Haridra churna is an effective antioxidant that can immediately soothe the irritation in the throat, reduce the inflammation and throat pain.

Internal medicine *Lakshmivilas rasa* has expectorant properties, which can help clear the respiratory passage and reduce congestion.

Chandraprabha vati - Mentioned in Ayurveda as Sarvaroga Pranashini (i.e. useful in all disorders), this potent herbal formulation balances all the Tridoshas i.e. Vata, Pitta and Kapha. help in cleaning the blood and improving oxygenation of the blood and improve the immunity. It has Balya and Rasayana as well antimicrobial , anti inflammatory, analgesic properties.

Sitopaladi churna helps remove dryness and release sputum out of the respiratory tract. This is due to its Vata and Kapha balancing properties. It also helps boost immunity due to its Rasayana property. Sitopaladi Churna has a Madhura and Katu Rasa and balances the Vata and Pitta Doshas and effectively removes the AMA doshas (i.e. harmful toxins) from the body.

*Talisadi Churna* is a herbal formulation commonly used in managing disorders of the upper respiratory and gastrointestinal tract. It has expectorant and helps to control cough, sore throat, and asthma by balancing the Kapha dosha and expectorant nature.

# Result

After one month of therapy there was significant improvement in the complaints related to Nasapratinaha. The reduction in the size of hypertrophied turbinate was observed

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along with nasal obstruction, headache, heaviness in head, pain over nose and sinuses, throat pain were reduced within a month. The investigation were repeated once again and there was normal in values. After the follow-up period of one

month, the patient had recovery from the disease symptoms such as nasal obstruction, headache and other symptoms. There were no side effects observed during the treatment as well as after the completion of treatment.



But patient was not willing for Nasya karma therefore we decided to go through the symptomatic treatment -Shirolepa, Tapasweda, Gandusha and the medicine.

This case study revealed that patient with *Nasapratinaha* (DNS) can gain significant relief in all sign and symptoms such as nasal obstruction, headache, pain over nose and sinus through ayurvedic management.

The study conclude that this line of treatment enhances the speed of recovery with minimal risk.
