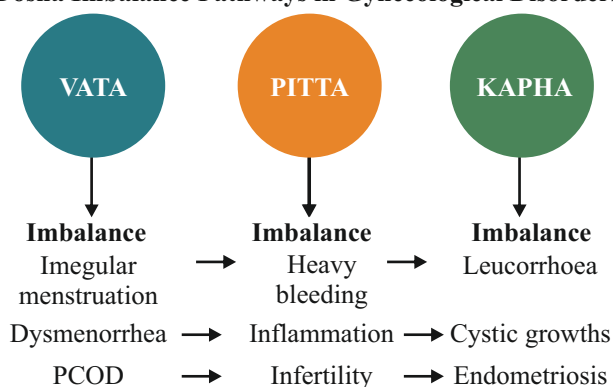
## Introduction

Ayurveda conceptualizes these conditions under *Yonivyapad*, describing 20 distinct gynecological disorders<sup>(1,2,3)</sup>. Unlike modern gynecology, which often focuses on symptomatic relief, Ayurveda emphasizes systemic balance, lifestyle, and psychosomatic dimensions<sup>(4,5)</sup>. This innovative approach offers a complementary paradigm for women's health care.

## Ayurvedic Framework in Gynecology

- **Yonivyapad:** Classical texts such as *Charaka Samhita* and *Sushruta Samhita* describe gynecological disorders as manifestations of dosha imbalance<sup>(1,2,3)</sup>. (Figure 1)

*Disorders*-visually mapping Vata, Pitta, and Kapha imbalances to modern gynecological conditions like dysmenorrhea, endometriosis, and PCOS.

• **Dosha Imbalance:**

- *Vata* ® irregular menstruation, dysmenorrhea, infertility<sup>(6)</sup>.
- *Pitta*® heavy bleeding, inflammation, endometriosis<sup>(6)</sup>.
- *Kapha*® cystic growths, PCOS, leucorrhea.

- **Holistic Diagnosis:** Ayurveda integrates diet, lifestyle, and emotional health into diagnostic and therapeutic frameworks<sup>(9)</sup>.

## Innovative Ayurvedic Approaches

## 1. Herbal Formulations

- *Ashoka* (*Saraca indica*): effective in abnormal uterine bleeding<sup>(7)</sup>.
- *Shatavari* (*Asparagus racemosus*): supports fertility and hormonal balance<sup>(8)</sup>.
- *Lodhra* (*Symplocos racemosa*): indicated in leucorrhoea and vaginal infections<sup>(9)</sup>.

## 2. Panchakarma Therapies

- *Uttarbasti*: medicated enema via vaginal route for infertility and endometriosis<sup>(10)</sup>.
- *Virechana*: purgation therapy for hormonal regulation<sup>(11)</sup>.

## 3. Lifestyle &amp; Dietary Modifications

- *Pathya-Apathya*: emphasis on wholesome diet and avoidance of aggravating foods<sup>(12)</sup>.
- Yoga and meditation for stress-induced gynecological disorders<sup>(13)</sup>.

#### 4. Integrative Potential

Ayurveda complements modern gynecology by addressing psychosomatic dimensions and offering cost-effective, patient-centered care with minimal side effects<sup>(14,15,16)</sup>.

#### Discussion

Ayurveda's innovative approach lies in its **preventive and holistic orientation**. While modern gynecology emphasizes surgical and pharmacological interventions, Ayurveda restores systemic balance through herbal therapeutics, Panchakarma, and lifestyle modifications<sup>(1,2,15)</sup>. This integrative model enhances outcomes in chronic gynecological disorders, particularly where conventional medicine faces limitations (e.g., recurrent PCOS, unexplained infertility)<sup>(16)</sup>.

Challenges include the need for randomized controlled trials, standardization of formulations, and global acceptance<sup>(14,17)</sup>. However, Ayurveda's emphasis on individualized care and psychosomatic health provides a unique advantage<sup>(18,19)</sup>.
